

 Note: Deeper insights and caveats to include or jargon to avoid This book is directed to YOU! Any time we say, "Share a story" or "Have them discuss..." we are addressing you, the facilitator.



◆ Sample Story Stories are key! This is how Jesus taught—a proven success! When we fall into "instructional mode" instead of story-telling, couples are less receptive. Real-life stories bring the content of the TOB diagrams to life, help the couples relate to the presenters as persons, and enable the couples to envision the guiding principles affecting their own future marriage. Feel free to use the stories we provide, or substitute your own. ▲ Presentation gives you a step-by-step instruction for what to say or do, based on what has worked in our experience. Perhaps you will come up with other ideas—we encourage you to "own" your presentation, but make sure you cover the Guiding Principles, which reflect the content in TOB.

Present to the engaged couples in "chunks." That is, several slides of PS are similar in content and thus should be grouped together. (Ex. Pages 10-11; 12-13; 14-15; 16-18; 26-29, etc.). Such cohesiveness helps the couple to grasp concepts better and moves the presentation along; going slide-by-slide in a detailed manner makes for a very long day. Get to the gist, especially through stories. TOBMP is not meant to be understood in one sitting. Each participant gets a book to take home and ponder.

## Outlines of the Day

Provides suggestions for the best use of time, whether you have 7 hours (one day or two nights) or 3 days of marriage preparation.

## Tough Issues

Goes more deeply into the theology of culturally difficult questions, such as Pornography, Abortion, Contraception, Sterilization, and In Vitro Fertilization. This guide is the fruit of successes and failures! We failed miserably several years ago, thinking that we needed to get through every single detail of Catholic doctrine to help engaged couples. Then we realized, as Pope Francis reminds us, that

# THE GOAL OF PRESENTING THE GOSPEL IS TO OPEN UP "SPACE" FOR PERSON-TO-PERSON ENCOUNTERS:

space for the individual to encounter Christ, space for the engaged couple to encounter each other, and space for the presenter and attendees to encounter each other as persons, rather than lecturers and students.

Accordingly, the greatest modification we made in our presentation is adding time for 2-Minute Sharing. Yes, the content is extremely important, but allowing the couples time, however brief, to dialogue with each other about the content is equally important. It demonstrates to them that we know the importance of these theological truths is not primarily academic, but rather it is the effect they will have on their married lives. This is why, no matter how short your time together, do not fail to schedule time for this important aspect of the presentation. Indeed, if you have the luxury of more time, use it for extended sharing, rather than lecturing.

#### **Before Opening the Book**

Recall that you are here to facilitate...not to lecture. Look for a funny guy and rely on him for group interaction.

#### Remember the Tips on Presenting:

Logos (ASolid Message) is covered by material. Ethos (A Trusted Speaker) is key—be yourself. Pathos (Emotional Connection)—it is not typically the mind that convinces, but the heart. Move them.

#### You need not cover everything!

Here we go. Time to start:

#### **Presentation**

- 1. Let's start with a prayer. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit... (Short, such as from the Wedding of Cana Prayer Cards).
- 2. LA
  - stand and share with the group their names, and the place and date of their wedding. Joke around and be attentive! (If > 50 couples, you can take turns throughout the day).

#### **Guiding Principles**

- ✓ TOB—what it means to be human, to have a body for love, and to be married.
- Open: Mind, Heart, Vision,
  Dialogue...that is Open-Ended
- Love—Free, Full, Faithful, and Fruitful, to 5th F, Family.
- "Verifying" love before vows

#### Sample Story

"I saw her at a coffee shop!" said Cesar. "I was overwhelmed...and was too scared to do anything about it. Then, she did not return for two years...until friends of mine wanted to set me up with a woman on the 4th of July. I agreed. It was her—Christina! I didn't want to lose her again. I got her number, we started dating...and yes, now we are married! I like to tell people that when she saw me, there were FIREWORKS! The rest is history!"

#### Presentation



- Be joyful! Start with THE STORY OF HOW YOU MET, before opening the book or changing first slide.
   Be brief (1-2 minutes), humorous, not overly pious.
- Introduce yourselves. Share how Christ and His
  Church have affected you. St. John Paul's Theology of
  the Body helped us realize what it means to be human,
  what it means to have a body for love and the wonder
  of marriage. We hope that you will be enriched by this
  amazing teaching.



3. Read through \* OPEN-MIND, OPEN-HEART, ETC.



- 4. Show \*THIS GUIDE LOOKS AT We will be covering the 4 F's of true love: Free, Full, Faithful, and Fruitful, which will form a 5th F—Family.
- 5. Before we push forward, please read silently what St. John Paul wrote about verifying love, the quotation in the middle of page one, starting with the words, "People should carefully verify...." (Pause) We are here to help you 'verify' your love.

- ✓ This program was made by sinners.
- ✓ The facilitators are not perfect.
- ✓ TOB can help you have a happy, healthy marriage & family life.
- ✓ Adam and Eve loved perfectly before the Fall.
- We all struggle with selfishness, but Jesus can help us to love.
- Our goal is heaven, the union of God with all of us.

#### **General Principles of TOB**

Pope St. John Paul gave 133 small talks from 1979 to 1984 known as the Theology of the Body. It is a Scriptural reflection on what it means to be human. We can't know who we are unless we know first, our roots—before the Fall of Adam and Eve, second, where we are headed—union with God in heaven, and lastly, our state now—we are fallen, but Jesus' redemption can heal us. We are made for love. Our bodies tell us that.


- Show \* WE ARE ON YOUR SIDE. Say something like, We are regular people. Our marriage isn't perfect, but TOB helped us make it better. It gives the "why's" behind the "what's" of Catholic teachings about love, and it's changing peoples lives. We want to share that with you.
- Please turn to page 2 and silently read the emboldened paragraph which starts with, "We are from different walks of life." (Pause)
- 3. Who are we to judge? Please know that St. John Paul says that the Church's teachings are not a condemnation, but an INVITATION to a life of freedom for lasting love.



- 4. Share GENERAL PRINCIPLES OF TOB
- 5. We hope this program challenges you & renews your love.

#### **Guiding Principles**

- Eros=Captivation and fascination and wonder
- Erotic love is God-given, and thus, good.

Note: For now, avoid discussing attraction as temptation to sin because of concupiscence. Focus on the role of sexual desire in initiating love. We will cover the fact that we are fallen later, but be upbeat right now. They are in love!

#### **Sample Story**

Clare saw him drive up...She had to take a deep breath; he was so handsome! She had known Randy in college when they were good friends, but they'd parted ways after graduation. They decided to rekindle their friendship, meeting half way between the two towns where they each lived. Randy was captivated by Clare's beauty and she was more than worth the drive. But their relationship didn't stop with that captivation. They've been married for years and say they love each other more and more every day!

#### Presentation




- 1. Show \* OUTLINE OF STRUCTURE

  We will cover the 4 F's of Free, full, faithful,
  and fruitful throughout the day, but first...
- 2. Show IN THE BEGINNING THERE WAS... ah, the Wonder of Marriage!

  Isn't it awesome to fall in love!?
- 3. Share A STORY OF WHEN YOU KNEW YOU WERE IN LOVE
- 4. Mutual Fascination is a key principle for Saint John Paul regarding marriage. He speaks of the wonder of attraction. Far from the Church being down on erotic love—we like it! Attraction is GOOD and necessary, but we know it is not enough on its own.
- 5. Have you ever thought about the words, "I'm in love"?
  It shows love is **bigger** than you—like a pond where you are in the water, soaked in love! It's bigger than you both!

#### **Guiding Principles**

- ✓ Guys are physically-charged ("with the eyes")
- ✓ Ladies are emotionally-charged ("with the heart")
- Complementarity—It is wondrous that the sexes are unique!

**Note:** Couples chatting with those nearby is SO crucial. It makes them feel more comfortable. Do not skip this. 6-8 minutes for 3-4 couples.

#### **Sample Story**

Christina gives a story about her parents' description of their first meeting, which illustrates perfectly seeing with the eyes and with the heart. "...Still after 40 years marriage, Dad says, 'Your mom was so hot! Still is! I knew I wanted to be with her forever.' Mom says, 'Your father has such a good heart. I knew from the beginning he cared so much about me."

#### **Presentation**



- L. Show SEEING: MAN / WOMAN
- 2. Share STORY OF ATTRACTION
  - 3. Men are physically charged, and women are emotionally charged. Not that guys don't have emotions or ladies don't have sexual desire, but that **primary** motivations are **biologically** different.
- 4. We are **complementary** (spelled with an "e" not "i"), meaning that we go together.



TABLE SHARING Have couples share with those closest to them about how they first met.



LARGE GROUP SHARING Volunteer your neighbor (or yourself) for the best story shared.

#### **Guiding Principles**

- ✓ Being "in love" is awesome.
- True love is deeper than "being in love."
- Real love is a decision of the will.

Note: Being "in love" is good—it is what first draws us. Help them distinguish the good feeling of being "in love" from the decision "to love."

#### **Presentation**



- 1. Show WHAT IS LOVE? and let them silently read the chart
- 2. Relate this to Pope Francis' comments of our "throw-away culture" (where we use and discard things) —and how this attitude is applied even to people and relationships.
- 3. Note last row—Forgiveness vs. Expecting Perfection. It was not an accident that our Lord gives the command to forgive 70 times 7 times, your spouse (and you!) being the ones most in need of forgiving and being forgiven…over and over.



4. Share A STORY OF IDEALIZED LOVE VS REAL LOVE

#### Sample Story

Ladies, your fiancée is your Knight-in-Shining-Armor in a sense. Go ahead, give him a kiss! (Pause) But, Disney and Hollywood do not depict the hardships, the frustrations, the conflict, and the need for forgiveness that true love can withstand. True love is a team sport, with both giving their all, even when it doesn't feel good. We can follow the instruction of Disney's Jasmine: "Follow your heart!" if we understand that the truth of following our hearts is not the **feeling** of love but the **decision** to love, through thick and thin.
